In a climate of 'credit crunch' healthcare, could social enterprise be used as an intervention to promote health and wellbeing?

Social enterprises are often involved in pioneering and transformational work that may help reduce pressure on public health providers within local authorities. But are we taking enough notice of their potential and what needs to happen to ensure social enterprise models are better employed across the North East? What organisations promote social enterprise for health? Is there an evidence base for such interventions? What is role for Universities and

Local Authorities? What are the risks and benefits of social enterprise?

The meeting will investigate the potential of social enterprise as a vehicle for public health within local authorities. Key note speakers will present case studies of social enterprises that are delivering aspects of the health agenda and present the latest evidence on how and if social enterprise can work with local authorities and academic partners to address persistent and widening health inequalities.
