

Qualitative Health Research Writing Group Network Residential Writing Retreat

Shepherds Dene, Northumberland, June 17th-19th 2015

In a beautiful rural setting this writing retreat offers you the chance to meet other PhD students and Early Career Researchers, share ideas, get expert guidance and make strides in your writing.

Supported by **The Wellcome Trust**, the purpose of the retreat is to provide delegates with dedicated writing time to work on producing specific outputs, whilst also providing input and advice on writing qualitative health research. **Prof. Rose Barbour** will be helping to facilitate the retreat, sharing with delegates her expertise on writing in this field, and helping to trouble shoot individuals' specific issues.

This exciting opportunity will run over three days, **Wednesday 17th June to Friday 19th June**, and will be held at **Shepherds Dene Retreat House** (www.shepherdsdene.co.uk) in Northumberland. Fifteen delegate places are available and attendance at the retreat will cost **£75.00**, which includes two nights' accommodation and all food, and are heavily subsidised. Two competitive hardship bursaries are available for unfunded PhD students.

Places are competitive and applications will be considered based on the merits and achievability of their anticipated outputs, with priority being given to existing QHRWGN members.
