Why children are a population health priority:

The health of our children today will determine the health of our population for generations to come. Every child today has the right to healthcare that supports them to thrive and does not limit their future potential, whilst not investing in young lives now will threaten our health services in years to come; when the true impact is felt by our communities, infrastructure and funding.

> With pressures on health and social care already stretched, the question is: *Can we afford NOT to invest in children's health?*

Three in ten children already live in poverty in the UK (31%). This has a profound impact on their lives now and for the future. It also costs the UK economy an estimated £39 billion annually. So whether from a moral or financial imperative, it is clear that now is the time to act to make improvements. There is much possible to address this, but requires collective action to make that happen.

Whilst there is great promise in the unfolding innovation and collaborative landscape, but this needs to be correctly harnessed to avoid worsening inequalities.
