- Founding member of the NIHR School for Public Health Research
















Fuse Research Programmes







What has Fuse achieved? (1st June 2013 – 16th March 2023)

- 474 Research grants have been awarded to Fuse Senior Investigators and staff generating an income of over £200m
- 1,399 publications have been reported by Fuse Senior Investigators/Fuse Researchers
- 518 engagement events have been organised
- 110 collaborations and partnerships reported
- Fuse Associate Members (academic and practice)
 currently at 472 and network membership at 1,755


