## PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (PICE) DEFINITIONS

#### PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

- Is about researchers working in active partnerships with members of the public.
- It is about research being carried out with or by members of the public, rather than to, about or for them.
- The term public includes service users, carers, families, patients, potential patients, and people who use health and social care services, as well as people from organisations, such as community groups, that represent people who use services.
- Public members can be of any age, children and young people, parents, working age people and older people.

#### PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT MEANS

- being more involved in the research itself:
- Identifying research topics and questions of importance to members of the public, patients and service users
- Offering advice and feedback as a member of a project's steering group or a public involvement group
- Helping to develop materials such as information sheets, interview guides or questionnaires
- Carrying out interviews with research participants
- Helping to share research findings and get research evidence into practice.
